

WELCOME

TO THE PARIS AIR SHOW – PARIS LE BOURGET



The Paris Air Show (PAS) makes the safety and security of its Visitors a priority, working in close cooperation with the competent authorities and security forces. Safety measures are constantly reassessed and tested during dedicated exercises. Some of these measures take visible form, like pat-downs at entrances; others are unobtrusive to ensure their effectiveness.

This Notice is designed to help you prepare for your visit to the Show by informing you of various regulations concerning safety and your own convenience during the visit.

DURING THE SHOW

1.1. ACCESSIBILITY TO THE SITE

For safety reasons, accessibility to the Site requires good health and a sound physical condition given the extent of the exhibition areas (over 70 ha), and weather conditions that are sometimes difficult and variable in June (storms or heatwaves). We invite you to adapt your outfit accordingly and to equip you with a cap to protect you from the sun. These recommendations are particularly important for young Visitors during the General Public days. Rest areas are provided, and we suggest using them as often as possible, especially in the Static Display area.

Consequently, all Visitors should check their state of **health before** coming to the Show and take note of any warnings, access conditions and safety rules by reading the brochures, the Show website (www.siae.fr) and information indicated at the entrance to the Show Site. For each category of population, Visitors, Exhibitors and Service Providers, there are different guides that contain safety-security rules, including the Technical Guide of the Show, where you will find rules for Build-up and Dismantling periods (for Exhibitors and Service Providers).

Restrictions based on these health and safety requirements in no way constitute discriminatory measures.

Pregnant women and disabled persons are not exempt from safety mesures but may call on one of the Show doctors at the entrance if pat-down procedures are problematic.

People who are permanently or temporarily disabled or who wish to enter with medical or paramedical equipment (crutches, respiratory devices with air cylinders, etc.) may be required to present appropriate medical proof to gain admittance to the Show.

1.2. ACCESS CONTROL

As well as pat-downs at the entrances, the PAS carries out inspections (either visual or with specific equipment) of your clothing, coats and other personal effects before you enter the Show.

If Visitors refuse to submit to pat-downs or visual inspections, the PAS is within its rights to forbid access to the Show or its car parks.

1.3. PROHIBITED OBJECTS

Please note that it is forbidden to take the following into the Show or its car parks:



objects considered as weapons or potential weapons: any category of weapon; any objects that could be used as projectiles (glass bottles, metal bars, etc.); any imitation or replica weapons; any portable workmen's tools (e.g. drill);



dangerous inflammable objects: any disabling or incapacitating chemical substances, gases or sprays (tear gas); any explosive or pyrotechnical materials or any other inflammable objects (firecrackers, torches, candles) and any bottles of liquefied or compressed gas (unless medical proof is provided):



consumables: any type of drug, stimulant or psychotrope. The introduction of alcohol on the Site is prohibited for Visitors and any Service Provider not belonging to the "Caterer" category;



objects that could disrupt the Show and disturb Service Providers: any documents, tracts, badges, insignia or banners of a political, ideological, philosophical, advertising or religious nature; any electronic or hand-operated sound instruments (megaphones, whistles, vuvuzelas, etc.); any flying objects or remotely controlled devices (drones); any laser pointers;



suitcases, bags or briefcases of a size larger than a carry-on baggage item: only luggage with a capacity of less than 15 litres will be allowed within the Show:



other objects such as: motorcycle helmets; any telescopic poles for cameras or mobile phones or any object considered inappropriate or disturbing by the PAS.

(CAUTION

Any person refusing to submit to the various control systems set up at the entrance to the Show will be refused access to the Show or its car parks. In addition, any objects prohibited by law discovered during pat-downs or inspections will systematically entail the intervention of the security forces.

1.4. BULKY ITEMS

The introduction of voluminous and/or cumbersome objects (in particular suitcases, luggage and briefcases) into the Show or its car parks is prohibited within the premises of the Show. These items may be subject to inspection in car parks





We recommend that you do not come to the Show with these items or to use the free luggage lockers (Gates L and O).

1.5. TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT

Unless medical proof is provided, subject to compliance with the circulation constraints imposed by the Organiser, it is forbidden to access the Show on roller skates, bicycles, push scooters, skateboards, Segways® or any other transportation device, whether or not motorised.


The possible use of golf cars on the Site, for Exhibitors and Service Providers only, is strictly regulated by the Organiser. These golf cars must be rented by the Organiser and drivers must respect the rules of the road, the traffic directions, the dedicated lanes, not exceed 20km/h and avoid any disturbing parking.

Any breach of these rules could lead to sanctions, such as the exclusion of the driver from the Site or the impounding of the golf-car.

1.6. CLOTHING

Suitable clothing is required, espacially during Trade Days. We would also advise you to adapt your clothing to the weather conditions, which can be difficult during the Show, e.g., storms or heatwaves

For security reasons, in application of the Circular of 2 March 2011 on the implementation of Act No. 2010-1192 of 11 October 2010 and Act 2019-90 of 10 April 2019 creating Article 431-9-1 of the Criminal Code prohibiting facial concealment in public areas,



it is forbidden to wear clothing that totally or partially conceals the face, except for medical reasons (proof required).

(CAUTION

Any person may be refused access to the Show or its car parks in case of non-compliance with these clothing regulations.

1.7. MINORS

During Trade Days, only minors who are part of a school or university group duly authorized by the Organiser, or aged over 16, are authorized to enter in the presence of their supervisors.

During General Public Days, the Show is open to minors, accompanied by an adult, however old they are. We do not recommend the coming of children under the age of 7, who are very sensitive to aircraft noise. We strongly advise against bringing children under 3 years old, who, in addition to the noise, will have to endure the crowd and potential bad weather (rain or heat).

However old they are, minors are under the control of their parents or supervisors, who are responsible for any damage they cause.


1.8. ANIMALS

Only service animals are admitted to the Show. They must be kept on a leash and supervised by their owners.

1.9. LEAVING THE SHOW

For Visitors, all exits from the Show are definitive. No re-admission is possible, except by special agreement of the PAS.

The Show close its doors to 6 pm: considering the security context and the sensibility the sensitivity of the material exhibited, any Visitor staying on the Stands, Chalets or other Sites of the Show beyond this time will be escorted as soon as possible to the exit of the Show by the Organiser's security personnel. In the event of refusal or protest, the PAS reserves the right to refer the matter to the police forces present on the Site and to lodge a complaint. Of course, the Organiser's security personnel will always use their discretion, for instance in the case of persons with reduced mobility.



2. HEALTH AND SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. BEHAVIOUR

Generally speaking, members of the public are requested to avoid causing any disturbance during the Show through their attitude, clothing or what they say, and to respect safety instructions.

The PAS may intervene and take the necessary measures in the event of:

- > theft.
- > public disorder,
- verbal or physical violence,
- offensive remarks,
- > demonstrations.
- > fraud.
- > swindles.
- > states of inebriation,
- offences against decency,
- > malicious behaviour.
- failure to comply with safety instructions or this Notice,
- secret and offensive surveillance of an Exhibitor or an exhibited product,
- > any acts of deliberate destruction,
- > racism.
- > etc.



riangle CAUTION

In case of trouble, the Show reserves the right to alert the police, file a complaint or escort a person outside the Show compound or car parks without any compensation or refund.

For safety reasons, it is forbidden to move around or run in a reckless manner.

To ensure a pleasant visit, we ask you to keep the venue and the installations clean, whatever the period. Waste bins are provided for this purpose at the exhibition Site during the Show.

For this purpose, a regular collection of waste for recycling is carried out during the Build-up, and waste garbage cans are available on the entire Exhibition Site during the Show.

2.2. EVACUATING THE SHOW PREMISES

The PAS management reserves the right to restrict or refuse access to the Show, and to evacuate all or part of the Show for safety reasons.

In addition, the PAS may proceed with a gradual evacuation of the Show a quarter of an hour before the official closing time, considering on the size of the Site.

2.3. THEFT AND DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

The PAS is not responsible for the theft or loss of your personal objects or damage to them within the Show compound and car parks. We recommend that you do not leave any valuables unattended.

2.4. NO SMOKING OR VAPING

Smokers and steamers are not allowed enclosed areas, the Static Display area, the General Public Grandstand and Chalet terraces.

2.5. VIDEO PROTECTION

The Show Site is equipped with a video protection system operated by the PAS and the competent authorities. This video protection system is used for **the safety of people, property and premises.** The PAS is responsible for the management of the system according to current legal provisions (articles L223-1 to L223-9 and L251-1 to L255-1 and R251-1 to R253-4 of the internal security code). The images are kept for 30 days and can be viewed in the event of an incident by security personnel and the police.

2.6. RIGHT TO THE IMAGE

Each person accepts the shots made during the Show and authorizes the PAS to use, reproduce and distribute his image, for the presentation and commercial promotion of the PAS.

Each person authorizes the PAS to use, reproduce and diffuse these views for institutional brochures, commercial documentations, press and advertising publications on websites and all media. This authorization is granted for 5 years after the end of the Show.

2.7 LOST AND ABANDONED OBJECTS

If you lose an item, you can contact directly the Show personnel and they will guide you to the different collection points for lost objects. Objects not collected during the Show are given to the Police Station of La Courneuve.

Furthermore, any luggage, package or suitcase left unattended on the Show, or its parking lots will be subject to a special procedure within the scope of the Vigipirate plan.

These procedures are similar to those applied in public transport. They may require the evacuation of all or part of a sector or Hall, temporarily interrupting your activity (Visitors, Exhibitors or Service Providers), when an appropriate security perimeter is established. We ask you to understand these rules and to apply them diligently, for the safety of all.



3. PROHIBITION OF ANY NON-AUTHORISED COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY

3.1. HAWKING AND THE DISTRIBUTION OF PROSPECTUSES

The sale of any goods and/or services within or beside the Show or in its car parks, and the distribution of tracts, leaflets and other printed material or panels by Visitors is strictly forbidden.

The resale of tickets or any other kind of admission document is forbidden and may incur legal action from the PAS.

3.2. CAMERA SHOTS, RECORDINGS AND COPIES

Any images, videos, sounds or photographs recorded by Visitors within the Show compound may only **be used for strictly personal and non-commercial purposes,** unless the PAS has granted specific written authorisation beforehand.

In addition, any non-accidental and repeated photographs of the security systems of the Show or an Exhibitor could entail the intervention of the police and/or the Organiser's security service, the confiscation of the images and/or videos and permanent exclusion from the Site.



4. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR VISITORS

4.1. ACCESS

Travel light, avoiding any bag or unnecessary luggage. As a reminder, only bags with a capacity of under 15 litres are authorised in the Show compound.

Objects exceeding the authorized limits may be deposited in free luggage lockers (Gates L and O). These luggage lockers are free of charge and available to all Visitors as long as they are available. Please, check that you did not bring any prohibited objects (cf 1.2).


Two main entrances, shuttles and parking are available:

- > Gate L vehicles: for parkings. It gives access to a pedestrian Gate with the same name, the Gate L pedestrian. This Gate also gives access to the bus station with shuttles that connect with the RER station. Gate L also have a Taxi station,
- Gate O: accessible to pedestrians on the public highway. Caution: please note that no deliveries can be made immediately next to this Gate for security reasons. Only **Taxis and passenger car with driver** have an area to drop off and pick up Visitors.
